






























<u>PB Vallejo Steering Committee Meeting February 5, 2013:</u> Update on Budget Delegate Phase

BUDGET DELEGATE COMMITTEES

1. Education

Facilitators: Aseem Mulji & Katy Miessner

Number of Delegates: 17

The Education Committee's project idea list includes afterschool programs, school facilities upgrades, arts and music programs, and sports programs. As of early February, their "High Priority" list focuses on afterschool programs.

2. Parks & Recreation

Facilitators: Elizabeth Little & John De La Torre

Number of Delegates: 16

The Parks & Recreation Committee's project idea list includes upgrades to GVRD parks and community center facilities, tennis court repairs, pools, skating rinks and parks, community gardens and farms, dog parks, solar panel installation, Mare Island Preserve and Heritage projects, and afterschool recreation programs. As of early February, their "High Priority" list focuses on parks & facilities upgrades, community gardens, tennis court repairs, afterschool recreation programs, Mare Island Preserve and Heritage projects, and solar panel installation.

3. Streets & Transportation

Facilitators: Betsy Morris & Bob Wolfe

Number of Delegates: 7

The Streets & Transportation Committee's project idea list includes beautification projects, sidewalk and street repair, bus shelters, increased public transit, tree planting, bikes, crosswalks, graffiti, traffic calming, street cleaning, utilities and waterfront improvements. As of early February, their "High Priority" list focuses on street repair, improving pedestrian safety and traffic calming, bus shelters, and waterfront improvements.

4. Community & Culture

Facilitators: Liz Ramos & Joey Lake

Number of Delegates: 22

The Community & Culture Committee has the broadest range of project idea. Their list includes animals, arts and music programs, community events and programs, homeless services, OZCAT & VCAT, museums, Florence Douglas Senior Center, public art, theaters, volunteer projects. As of early February, their "High Priority" list includes project ideas in each of these categories.

5. Economic Development

Facilitators: Shelee Loughmiller & Johnny Walker

Number of Delegates: 32

The Economic Development Committee's project idea list includes support for small businesses, job training, housing and homeownership projects, Vallejo branding and tourism, downtown-focused projects including free wifi, retail development, . As of early February, their "High Priority" list includes project ideas in each of these categories, excluding retail development.

6. Public Safety

Facilitators: Lynda Daniels & Pippin Dew

Number of Delegates: 8

The Public Safety Committee's project idea list includes better tracking of code violations at abandoned or dilapidated property, lighting projects, surveillance cameras, increasing security & law enforcement, graffiti abatement, and drug courts. As of early February, their "High Priority" list focuses on code violations tracking, lighting, surveillance cameras, and drug courts.

7. Youth

Facilitators: Ginny Browne & Mari Villaluna

Number of Delegates: 8

The Youth Committee works on all project lists. As of early February, their "High Priority" list includes afterschool mentoring and volunteer programs, fitness equipment in parks, repairs to school facilities, arts programs, homeless services, and cultural programming, including Tagalog classes and funding for the annual Pow-Wow.

8. Spanish

Facilitators: Ramon Quintero Number of Delegates: 8

The Spanish Committee works on all project lists. As of early February, their "High Priority" list includes microenterprise funds/small business development programs, Spanish language programming on OZCAT, mural projects, and child care at libraries.
